# 3x3 Basketball

## Eligibility Guidelines

### INTRODUCTION

This guideline outlines the AUS eligibility requirements of 3x3 basketball competitors in order to provide clarification for participants and AUS members. It is the participant's and member's responsibility to ensure that all athletes are eligible to attend and compete in the AUS event.

### 1. WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

In order to be eligible to compete in an AUS event, the student (for the duration of the event) must:

- Be a currently enrolled student
- Be proceeding towards a certificate or higher award offered by the member university or by a recognised feeder school of the university
- Be able to prove their identity, and must be able to prove their enrolment if requested
- Be covered by personal accident / injury insurance
- Have authorisation from the member that the student is eligible to compete (via the online registration process or eligibility form)
- Have accepted the terms and conditions of the AUS participation agreement

### 2. TEAM ELIGIBILITY

In order to be eligible to compete in the AUS 3x3 basketball competition the team must:

- In accordance with FISU regulations, all competitors be aged a minimum of 17 as of 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017 and no older than 24 as of 31<sup>st</sup> December 2017. All DOB's will be checked in the university approval of eligibility.
- The four competitors in each university team do not have to remain the same throughout the qualification pathway i.e. at RUG and Qualifying Final.
- Due to tight time frames between the qualification and entry deadlines for the FISU WUL, all Qualifying Final participants must have a current Australian passport with validity for 6 months following the FISU 3x3 Basketball World University League competition (October 2017).

### 3. FISU OCEANIA 3X3 BASKETBALL WORLD UNIVERSITY LEAGUE QUALIFYING FINAL

The FISU Oceania 3x3 WUL Qualifying Final, presented by JanSport, will be held 2-3 August 2017. The winning male and female teams will each be awarded an Australian University Sport Championship pennant. The registration fee is \$60 per participant.

The winning male and female team will then qualify to compete at the 3x3 FISU World University League in China from 14-17 October. To be eligible all team members of the basketball competition must comply with points 1 & 2 above. The fee for participation in the 3x3 FISU World University League is a one-off accreditation fee of 30 Euro per person. Flight costs and accommodation will be covered by the organising committee, not the students. One team official will be allowed to travel with the team however the team official will be responsible for their own cost (including flights and accommodation).
